In our area, advertising children's ministry can sometimes raise concerns due to past incidents involving false religions. Yet the Lord blessed us with a wonderful VBS, and we were even able to minister to a new family. Our church members did all the work with zeal, and it was a blessing to see how much they've grown and taken ownership of the ministry.

Another summer highlight was the chance to participate in Camp BIMI, where young people interested in missions came together for instruction and sharpening. It was a privilege to play a small part in what God did that week, as we witnessed hearts being stirred for the Great Commission. The fellowship and focus on missions were refreshing and encouraging, both for the campers and for us as we shared in their passion.

As summer came to a close, we welcomed three new members into the church. It was a joy to see how all three had grown in their knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ through our church, and they are already active in areas like media and building maintenance. Please pray for their continued growth in Christ, and that more people would commit themselves to serving in the local church. The fall season kicked off with many teaching opportunities. Eric continues teaching a Bible college class remotely at FaithWay Baptist College of Canada, which has been a privilege for several years now. He also had the opportunity to travel to Ivory Coast once again, where he taught a one-week module at a Bible college and enjoyed fellowship with dear missionary friends. Meanwhile, the Bible institute here in Laval began its fall course in September, with 17 students enrolled. The classes, both in Ivory Coast and Laval, are conducted in French, and we are grateful for these teaching opportunities.

Melissa continues to train the next generation of church musicians. About ten young people are learning to accompany church music on the piano, and their proficiency levels vary. It's also a joy to have several other instruments involved in our services, with young people serving the Lord through their music. Beyond numerical growth, we are especially thankful for the increasing involvement and maturity of the church. As you read through this letter, we hope you see the recurring theme of God's work deepening the faith and commitment of our church family.

On the home front, Daniel and Aiden are doing well in school and love serving the Lord. Daniel is also working a part-time job, saving for his future Bible college studies. Both boys are a blessing to us, and we are thankful for everyone who prays for our family. We know that these blessings are God's answers to your prayers, as well.
